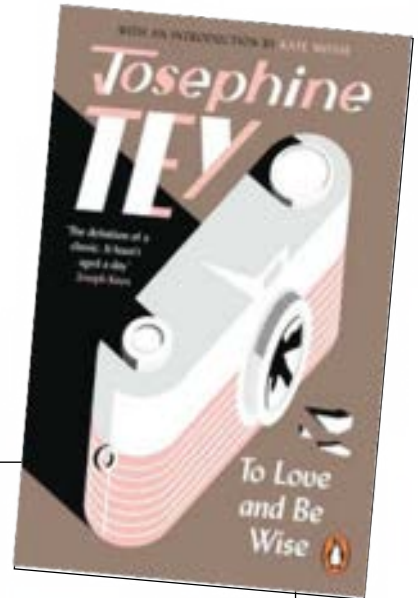


To Love and Be Wise by Josephine Tey
