Lettre au DILCRAH

Madame Cindy Leoni,

Alliance LGB is the only organization dedicated to protecting the rights of LGB people: Lesbians, Gays, and Bisexuals. We are part of the LGB International coalition, which is composed of organizations from 24 countries, from Taiwan to Brazil. We are writing to you today to ask which community is represented by the "+" in LGBT+.

Normally, when it comes to combating hatred and discrimination, it is necessary to know whom we are talking about. We know who LGB people are people with a non-heterosexual sexual orientation. However, we do not know who is included in the "+" of LGBT+. Within the framework of the National Plan for Equality and against Anti-LGBT+ Hatred and Discrimination (2023-2026), we are simply asking which people are included under the "+" sign.

For our part, Alliance LGB is an association that fights against homophobia and all hatred directed at Lesbian, Gay, and Bisexual people. We strongly criticize what we regard as the new form of conversion therapy: the transition of minors. In France, while Northern Europe and Great Britain are reversing course, minors are being placed on the path toward a sterilizing and mutilating medical transition. Most of these young people, if left to themselves, would simply have grown up to become LGB people comfortable in their own skin.

In order to clarify which groups of people are protected by the National Plan, we ask whether LGB people remain the priority, or whether our voices have been set aside in favor of a nebulous acronym that no longer represents the silent majority of LGB people, who have been pushed aside by a radical activism that has taken our movement hostage.
